The winners from each category were applauded for their outstanding creativity. The entire program filled the school environment with joy, festivity, and togetherness.

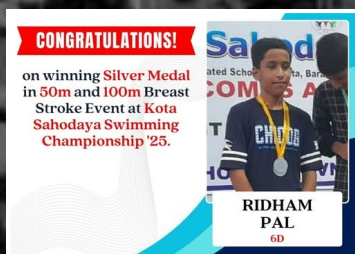
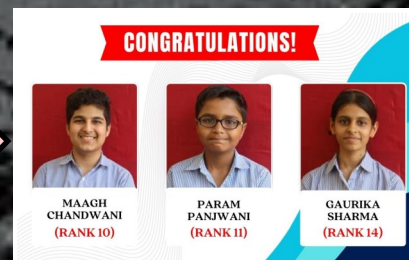
The celebration concluded with the message that festivals are best celebrated with creativity, unity, and joy.
